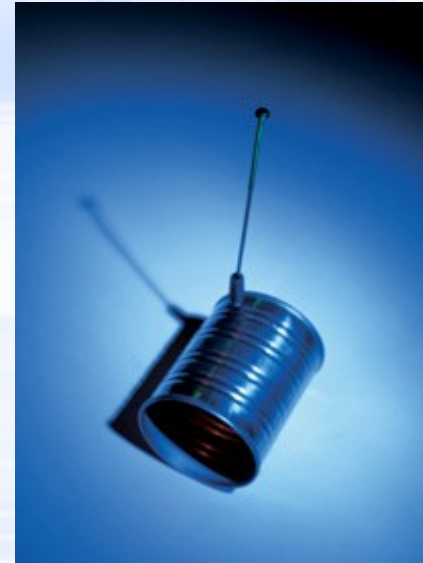

EMS Radio

When EMS responds they are out of service until they put self in service.

Cannot abandon one patient for another

Call signs are by the unit - individuals rarely are identified
